Bible Reading

Luke 24 ¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵ As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus Himself came up and walked along with them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing Him. ¹⁷ He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?" They stood still, their faces downcast. ¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, asked Him, "Are you only a visitor to Jerusalem and do not know the things that have happened there in these days?" ¹⁹ "What things?" He asked. "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. ²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed Him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified Him; ²¹ but we had hoped that He was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. ²² In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning ²³ but didn't find His body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said He was alive. ²⁴ Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but Him they did not see." ²⁵ He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter His glory?" ²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning Himself. ²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if He were going farther. ²⁹ But they urged Him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So He went in to stay with them. ³⁰ When He was at the table with them, He took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him, and He disappeared from their sight. ³² They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" ³³ They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together ³⁴ and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." ³⁵ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when He broke the bread.
